

Growth Mindset Program

With the book characters, Happy Thoughts and Hard Work

This program is all about setting goals and overcoming obstacles. The fun begins with a drawing demo and it's filled with audience participation. Students see growth mindset in action as I "struggle" with our interactive art demo and The Dream Keepers volunteers help me out. Kids also learn about the illustration and writing process, the importance of Character, Action, and Setting, and how to apply **Happy Thoughts** and **Hard Work** to their own goals and build habits for persistence and positivity. A reading of the book, plus Q & A time is also included.

Presentation Length: 40-45 minutes

Optional 1 hour during lunch/recess to chat with students and sign books.
